Job description

SOCK's Youth Philanthropy Program helps kids discover and activate their natural philanthropic spirit. We do this by teaching older teens the importance of giving and serving, encouraging high school seniors to graduate by helping them complete their required culminating projects, and by providing a way for youth to take action on issues that are important to them.

This internship offers students the opportunity to work with juniors and seniors in Shelton High School, CHOICE High School, and North Mason High School. An intern's job will be to help carry out various aspects of the Youth Philanthropy Program including visiting Mason County high schools to teach students about the Youth Philanthropy program, inspiring them to become involved in their community, and acting as their mentor. The intern may also meet with counselors, teachers, and other school staff to provide information about our program as well as form an on-going partnership between school staff and SOCK. Part of an intern's work will include office organization, computer work, and research as needed to carry out the program. Interns with an interest in fund raising may also help with grant writing.
